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Psalm 73 A psalm of Asaph (BOOK III Psalms 73-89)

¹Surely God is good to Israel, to those who are pure in heart.

²But as for me, my feet had <u>almost slipped</u>; I had nearly lost <u>my foothold</u>. ³For I **envied** the *arrogant* when I saw the prosperity of the *wicked*. ⁴They have *no struggles*; their bodies are *healthy and strong*. ⁵They are *free from* common human burdens; they are *not plagued* by human ills. ⁶Therefore *pride* is their necklace; they clothe themselves with *violence*. ⁷From their callous hearts comes iniquity; their evil imaginations have no limits. ⁸They scoff, and speak with *malice*; with *arrogance* they threaten *oppression*. ⁹Their mouths lay claim to heaven, and their tongues take possession of the earth. ¹⁰Therefore their people turn to them and drink up waters in abundance. ¹¹They say, "How would God know? Does the Most High know anything?" ¹²This is what the wicked are like— always free of care, they go on amassing wealth.


have been afflicted, and every morning brings new punishments. ¹⁵If I had spoken out like that, I would have betrayed Your children. ¹⁶When I tried to understand all this, it **troubled me deeply** ¹⁷till I entered the sanctuary of God; then I understood their final destiny. ¹⁸Surely You place them on slippery ground; You cast them down to ruin. ¹⁹How suddenly are they destroyed, completely swept away by terrors! ²⁰They are like a dream when one awakes; when You arise, Lord, You will despise them as fantasies. ²¹When my heart was grieved and my spirit embittered, ²²I was senseless and ignorant; I was a brute beast before You. ²³Yet I am always with You; You hold me by my right hand. ²⁴You guide me with Your counsel, and afterward You will take me into glory. ²⁵Whom have I in heaven but You? And earth has nothing I desire besides You. ²⁶My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever. ²⁷Those who are far from You will perish; You destroy all who are unfaithful to You. ²⁸But as for me, it is good to be near God. I have made the Sovereign LORD my refuge; I will tell of all Your deeds.

Background to Psalm 73: Asaph & Place of Psalm 73 (see Ps 1)

Affirmation of view of God: The way it is . . . God is good and . . . surely goodness and mercy shall follow me (Ps 23:6) vs 1

But then . . . a doubter's confession of envy vs 2, 3

- As for me . . . slipping with envy of what I saw: a theology to reality clash
- The comparison game:



- Feel embittered, raw deal, dissatisfaction, grieved, cheated, covetous Twisted and painful experiences of morality, economics, wellbeing, and justice turned upside down vs 4-14
- Questioning alignment of experiences with promises ("surely in vain")

Experiences of betrayal and depression vs 15, 16

Dramatic turning point through perspective of worship vs 17

The big picture: The wicked revisited vs 18-20

Trading short-term and **empty envy for** the long-term **presence of God** vs 21-26

Re-Affirmation: As for me . . . vs 27, 28
