

## **Ethical Maturity as Kingdom Discipleship**

## A. Ethical Maturity as Seeking the Kingdom of God, Time and God's Truth Applied

Hebrews 5:11-6:1, 9-12 <sup>11</sup>We have much to say about this [Christ being the source of our eternal salvation and high priest], but it is hard to make it clear to you because you no longer try to understand. <sup>12</sup>In fact, though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you the elementary truths of God's word all over again. You need milk, not solid food! <sup>13</sup>Anyone who lives on milk, being still an infant, is not acquainted with the teaching about righteousness. <sup>14</sup>But solid food is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil.

<u>Therefore</u> let us move beyond the elementary teachings about Christ and **be** taken forward to maturity . . . <sup>9</sup>Even though we speak like this, dear friends, we are convinced of better things in your case—the things that have to do with salvation. <sup>10</sup>God is not unjust; He will not forget your work and the <u>love you</u> have shown Him as you have helped His people and continue to help them. <sup>11</sup>We want each of you to <u>show</u> this same **diligence** to the very end, so that what you hope for may be fully realized. <sup>12</sup>We do not want you to become lazy, but to **imitate** those who through <u>faith and patience</u> inherit what has been promised.

## **B. Stirred but Not Shaken: Earlier Message from Hebrews 12** (July 12<sup>th</sup>, 2015)

We have described the Kingdom of God (of Heaven) as the range of God's effective will; where what God wants done is done. It is God and His everlasting reign. We are called to yield to Him as our King and our Anchor. We need to be stirred to love Him with our whole being and to receive His Kingship in our lives. In so doing we can not be shaken. The triune God is our covenant keeping, sanctifying, healing and redeeming God who has never lost a battle and His kingdom WILL NOT be shaken. In Him our longings are fulfilled and our fears are quelled: we are safe, secure, significant, and unshaken. (1 Corinthians 3:10-15; Romans 8:28, 38, 39)

Hebrews 12: 28, 29: Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be thankful, and so worship God acceptably with reverence and awe, for our "God is a consuming fire." Romans 12:1, 2: Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will. Hebrews 13: 8: Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.

## C. What Does Kingdom Living Look Like (Relationships, Responsibilities, Reliance)

- 1. Ethics in Relation to Others (Heb 13:1-3)
  - Sustained love for insiders and outsiders (1, 2)
  - **Sympathetic** love for those suffering (3)
- 2. Ethics in Relation to Ourselves (Heb 13:4-9)
  - Sexual discipline (4) 1 Cor 6:18-20; 1 Cor 9:27; Mt 5:27-32
  - Satisfaction (5, 6): content and confident, not covetous Lk 12:15; 1 Tim 6:6-10
  - Solidarity with leaders (7) and their positive example
  - Steadfast trust in Jesus (8): in context of strange teaching and contrary culture
  - Shun strange teaching (9) Gal 1:6-9
- 3. Ethics in Relation to God (Heb 13:10-19)
  - **Separation unto God** (pursuit of holiness) and away from profane
  - Sacrifice of praise (15, 16) in words and deeds
  - Submission to leaders, conscience, and ways of God (18, 19)
- 4. The Dynamics of Kingdom Ethics (Heb 13:20, 21)

Now may the God of peace, who through the blood of the eternal covenant brought back from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep, <sup>21</sup> equip you with everything good for doing his will, and may he work in us what is pleasing to him, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen.
